H98 EAST POOL & AGAR: A CORNISH MINING LEGEND by Philip Heffer, 1985. The history of the East Pool and Wheal Agar mining companies is one of absorbing interest to anyone researching the subject of Cornish mining in the 19th and 20th centuries. 60 pages, neat old photos, softcover. \$15.95 pp.

H161 A HISTORY OF COPPER MINING IN CORNWALL AND DEVON by D.B. Barton, 1978. This book is devoted solely to the history of the copper mines of West of England and traces the development of the industry from its pioneer Elizabethan days through the years of greatness from 1750 to 1850 – when Cornwall dominated the world's copper markets – to the final decline in the closing years of the nineteenth century. 96 pages, illustrations, softcover. \$18.00 pp.

H178 THE BRITISH LEAD MINING INDUSTRY by Roger Burt, 1984. This book covers all aspects of the lead mining industry, from its earliest developments through the significant changes of the 17th, 18th, and 19th centuries. 344 pages, hardcover, dust jacket. \$35.00 pp.

H618 SOUTH CROFTY OLD WORKINGS by Deakin, Buckley & Riekstins, 1999. H1196 DOWN HILL BOTH WAYS: THE ATLANTIC MINING COMPANY'S SYSTEM OF RAILROADS by Cecil Cook, 2015. The Atlantic Mining Company, located in Michigan's Copper Country was said to have produced in its lifetime, 121,844,995 pounds of copper from ore running 11-20 pounds of copper per ton.
